On the 28th February, 2012, the Gaels of Omagh St. Enda's marked the 80th anniversary of the club's formation.

It was an opportunity to reflect on eight decades of nostalgia and to celebrate the progress of our club which rose from humble beginnings in 1932 when a group of GAA enthusiasts answered the call to instil a new level of 'Gaelic Spirit' in the town.
